I am Suzy Costello and am doing an art installation for Massey BFA that explores the space where human ritual interacts with nature. One of my projects focuses on the 80 year old pohutakawa trees recently removed from St Alban's Church frontage, looking specifically at honouring the space the trees created for the families of Eastbourne in the context of christenings, marriages and deaths (and any other moments).

I'd really appreciate it if families of the Anglican parish might share with me some of their family photographs that have captured these moments during the last 80 years, with reference to the pohutakawa trees (i.e. the trees need to be in the photo too!).

I'm hoping to create a photo montage to support an art installation that will be performed (with the help of locals) in front of the church where the trees grew. The images will be used in a video that will digitally record the performance and made available to Massey staff for assessment purposes only (due to Covid-19 Massey requires me to digitally record the event). The images will not be made public online.
